The College Commits to Maintaining Quality of Training Amid FY 2024/2025 Budget Rationalization

N airobi, Kenya – In a decisive move to ensure the continued excellence of training across all Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC) campuses, CEO Dr. Kelly Oluoch has reiterated the institution's commitment to quality training in spite of the rationalization of the FY 2024/2025 recurrent budget.

Dr. Oluoch highlighted the College's ongoing initiatives to enhance service delivery, including the recruitment of new staff and digitalization. He encouraged all Principals to adopt measures to mitigate the effects of budget cuts, such as harmonized teaching initiatives.

In line with the Public Finance Management Act, the College will spend up to 15% of the rationalized budget until the Finance Bill is assented into law. Dr. Oluoch reassured staff that no payroll items, including salaries, house allowances, and commuter allowances, will be affected.

The CEO's commitment to sustaining the quality of training underscores KMTC's dedication to its mission of producing fit-for-purpose health professionals, even in the face of financial challenges.

CEO Visits Exam Centres to Assess Preparedness for Final Qualifying Examinations

C EO Dr. Kelly Oluoch, accompanied by Deputy Director of Academics Dr. Nyawira Mwangi and Registrar Mr. Ronald Wasike, visited Nairobi Campus to assess the preparedness for the Final Qualifying Examinations. During their visit, they joined the students to offer motivation and encouragement.

A total of 13,722 students are currently sitting for their exams, reflecting the culmination of their rigorous academic training. Dr. Oluoch emphasized the importance of these examinations in ensuring the students are well-equipped to become competent health professionals ready to serve both locally and globally.

The visit underscores KMTC's commitment to supporting its students and maintaining high standards of education and examination integrity.

Staff Retirement Benefit Schemes Hold AGM



A fter successfully recruiting over 400 new employees across various departments, the College is now organizing the third phase of its induction training program for the newly appointed staff. This training follows the first two sessions held in Mombasa from November 13-17, 2024 and in Kisumu from June 3-14, 2024. The upcoming training is scheduled to take place in Mombasa from July 15 to 26, 2024.

The first team of inductees will undergo training from July 15 to 19, while the second cohort is scheduled for July 22 to 26, 2024. This comprehensive induction program is a crucial step in ensuring that the new staff are well-prepared to contribute to KMTC's mandate of providing high-quality healthcare training, conducting research and consultancy.

KMTC Urges County Government to Expedite Title Deed Process and Support Graduates' Employment Opportunities

he Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC) Nyandarua Campus hosted a Resource Mobilization-cum-Cultural Day to explore potential partnerships and cooperation with the County Government of Nyandarua. The event garnered significant attention, bringing together the campus community and 28 members of the County Assembly.

KMTC's CEO, Dr. Kelly Oluoch, represented by the Registrar, Mr. Ronald Wasike, urged the County Government to expedite the title deed process for the Nyandarua Campus and to consider KMTC graduates for job opportunities. He also advocated for the secondment of part-time lecturers and emphasized the importance of bursary allocations for students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

Dr. Oluoch highlighted KMTC's vision and mission of producing competent health professionals who are fit-for-purpose and can work globally. "KMTC is renowned for producing competent health professionals. I urge applicants to take responsibility and apply for any course because KMTC trains fit-for-purpose professionals who can work anywhere globally," said Dr. Oluoch.

Speaking during the celebrations, the Chief Guest, Senator John Methu, expressed pride in Nyandarua County hosting two KMTC campuses - Kinangop and Nyandarua. He highlighted the economic benefits these campuses have brought to local residents, including job opportunities and economic development.

Senator Methu outlined a comprehensive series of commitments from the County Government aimed at supporting KMTC. These commitments include infrastructural support, providing financial aid for students, and improving campus facilities as well as connectivity. Additionally, plans were discussed for upgrading JM Kariuki County Referral Hospital to a Level 6 facility to accommodate more KMTC students and increase the chances of graduates being absorbed into the workforce upon completion of their studies. The event saw the participation of key figures; KMTC's Head of Intergovernmental Relations, Dr. Leah Bii, Principals: Mrs. Winfred Nguih (Nyandarua), Mr. Peter Guchu (Kinangop), the Governor's representative, County Executive Committee Member for Roads and Infrastructure Mr. Peter Ng'ang'a, Members of the County Assembly, staff, and students.

KMTC Homabay Campus Signs MoU with Aga Khan Hospital Kisumu

The Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC) Homa Bay campus signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Aga Khan Hospital in Kisumu to enhance academic collaboration and improve healthcare training programs. The partnership emerged following the recent expansion of Aga Khan Hospital, which transformed from a 70-bed facility into a 123-bed capacity hospital. This growth has enabled the hospital to offer care in over 30 clinical specialties and subspecialties, ranging from cardiology to neonatology, and host the region's first Sleep Lab for diagnosing and treating sleep disorders.

The MoU aims to enhance KMTC Homa Bay's academic programs through clinical attachment opportunities in disciplines such as Physiotherapy, Nursing, Nutrition, and Dietetics, as well as other emerging fields. The agreement also includes discussions on joint research projects and curriculum development, focusing on new and evolving fields in health professional training.

Representing Aga Khan Hospital Kisumu at the signing was Chief Executive Officer Ms. Mary Oduor who noted that the collaboration is expected to significantly benefit students by providing hands-on experience and exposure to advanced medical practices, ultimately improving the quality of healthcare training at KMTC Homa Bay.

This strategic partnership underscores KMTC's commitment to providing top-tier health training and education, aligning with its Vision to be "A globally competitive institution for training human resources for health".


